

AFTER RELOCATION – WHAT TO EXPECT

Relocating a building is a complex process. Some changes to the building are normal and expected.

NORMAL EFFECTS OF RELOCATION

You may notice:

- minor cracking in walls or ceilings
- movement in doors and windows
- slight shifts in alignment
- cosmetic damage to finishes

These are a natural result of lifting, transporting, and placing the building.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

Following relocation, you may need to arrange:

- internal and external finishing work
- repairs to minor damage
- rejoining of building sections (if applicable)
- installation of bracing or additional structural elements
- ensuring the building remains weatherproof

SETTLING PERIOD

The building may settle slightly after placement. Some adjustments may be required over time.

IMPORTANT

The Contractor's role is limited to the relocation and placement of the building as agreed.

Further finishing or remedial work is not included unless specifically agreed.
